THE SPRING BREAK RISK PROFILE

DANGER OF UNFAMILIAR ROADS

Fatal crashes with out-of-state teens increase in unfamiliar tourist hubs.



9% FATALITY SPIKE

CDC: Spring Break crashes involving drivers under 25 are 9% more likely to be fatal."



23% DRUNK DRIVING INCREASE

Drunk driving rises 23% during Spring Break.



4X NIGHTTIME RISK

Fatal crash rate for teens 16-17 is 4x higher at night.

SPRING BREAK SURVIVAL CHECKLIST

- Check Your Car Before You Go**
Check tires, fluids, and lights before you go. Know your route — not while driving.

THE PENNY TIRE TEST

Insert a penny upside down into the tread. See Lincoln's full head? Replace your tires.

- Buckle Up - Every Trip. Every Seat. Every Time.**
Seatbelts cut death risk by 45% and serious injuries by 50%. Seat Belts can save lives!
- Activate 'Do Not Disturb' Mode**
Turn it on before you drive. Notifications can wait. Your life can't.
- Lock In a Safe Ride Home**
Arrange a sober ride with friends or parents before you go out. No questions asked — just a safe way home.

SAFETY TIPS FOR YOUR TRIP



Work Zones = Slow Zones

Expect construction along your route. Follow signage and slow down.



See a Motorcycle? Give Space

Give motorcycles/mopeds extra space — they're at higher injury risk. Stay alert.



Share the Road with Bikes, Scooters & Pedestrians

Yield to pedestrians. Make eye contact before proceeding. If they don't see you — wait.



Build an Emergency Safety Pack

Pack jumper cables, a first-aid kit, water, snacks, a blanket, and a flashlight. Keep in your trunk.

FOLLOW YOUR GDL LAW

"Your GDL may restrict driving with friends or without an adult — even if you have your license. Know your state's rules. Don't accept rides from newly licensed teens either."

2X

Crash risk doubles with 1 peer passenger

3X

Crash risk triples with 2+ teen passengers

Your license could be suspended or lost forever if you violate your state GDL law
